Word count limit

- The entry should not be more than 200 words. Accepted styles include:
 - Two-sentence story
 - Dribble (exactly 50 words)
 - Drabble (exactly 100 words)
 - Microfiction (not more than 200 words).

1. The story must be **based in Singapore**.
2. It should ideally include **sci-fi elements** and be **set in the future**. Participants may write about time travelling to the past/present or vice versa.
3. Please note that we do not accept any works that promotes any form of discrimination, including towards any nationality, religion, gender, or race.

Topic: Food

1. What are we eating in the future?

Example: Invention of vitamin pills in the flavour of Nasi Lemak or Laksa, each pill fulfills the calorie intake of one meal.

2. How would local food production have developed?

The 30 by 30 goal: will we hit 30% of locally produced food by 2030? What innovative ways of food production can be done aside from vertical farms and lab-grown meat?

3. Write about our F&B sector of the future.

Example: Hawker stalls are now run by AI. Everyone would own a private AI chef. There is a food simulation restaurant where people's brain are tricked into eating their favourite unhealthy food when they are actually eating salad.

Write about new elderly-assisting technologies.</div> <div>Example: Synthetic limbs, robotic parts, sensor detecting rubber walls to cushion the elderly in case of fall.</div> <div>2. Write about the shift in perception towards old age and death.</div> <div>Will 3-Gen flats increase or decrease? Do young people still follow funeral rites? Maybe we can register our ‘ashes’ in the cloud and save a digital version of ourselves?</div> <div>3. Write about the ageing of today’s youth.</div> <div>Example: SingPass verification is now done via brainwaves, but the new elderly are only familiar with verifying via the phone’s app; mobile phones are now outdated.</div> </div> </div> </div> </div>		
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Topic: Education

*** These are sample prompts to get the ideas going, feel free to write outside of these prompts!*

1. Will schools and teachers be replaced by tech and AI?

Example: Every student now owns a pair of AR headset to attend classes virtually; nobody has to attend physical classes anymore.

2. Can technology speed up the educational process?

Example: Education chips are implanted into every child; children will be able to complete their basic education and graduate by the age of 7.

3. Write about unique SG student's culture.

Example: Instead of going to a library/cafe, students enter a "mugging game simulation" where they enter a digital space with their friends to revise, and each topic completed grants rewards similar to completing a game's mission.

Topic: Transport

*** These are sample prompts to get the ideas going, feel free to write outside of these prompts!*

1. What would be some new features to the MRT system with the expansion of lines?

Example: Taking a new train and suddenly gets transported into the past/future.

2. How much further will our transport system develop?

Example: Every housing unit is registered in the transmission network. We can key in the coordinates and be transported to wherever we want [in the country] in a few seconds.

3. Write about a common occurrence in public transport that will continue to exist in the future.
